Brewed with German hops, this pilsener was awarded 'Grand Champion' at the 1999 Australian International Beer Awards.

Powerful hop flower aromas blended beautifully with fruity malt flavours – no XXXX!				
Austria	4. Eggenberg HopfenKönig	330	5.1	2.50
A pale yellow pils, with a bright, hoppy flavour – slightly sweet, with no bitter after-taste.				
	77. Eggenberg Urbock	330	9.6	3.60
An amber beer with a sweet aroma. Malty flavours with a mild, bitter finish.				
Canada	5. Sleemans Honey Brown Lager	341	5.2	2.60
Refreshingly smooth, yet full-bodied. Those Canucks prefer a hint of honey to sweeten the finish.				
China	6. Zhu Jiang	330	5.3	2.60
Pearl River beer, brewed with Czech hops, German yeast, Canadian Barley and Chinese rice – truly international, truly refreshing.				
Corsica	7. Pietra Colomba Blanche	330	5.0	2.60
Shrub land herbs impart spiciness to this cloudy white beer – citrus, coriander and ginger are the more prominent notes.				
	8. Pietra Ambreé	330	6.5	2.80
Chestnut flour is the unique ingredient of this malty treat. The slightly sweet aroma belies the woody, nutty finish.				
France	9. Kasteel Cru	330	5.2	2.80
Champagne yeast and spring water from Les Voges mountains give a slight sparkling acidity to this refreshing treat.				
	10. Jenlain Ambreé	330	7.5	2.90
A classic Bière de Garde, from northern France. Plum and berry flavours lead to a tangy, dry aftertaste.				
	11. Pelforth Brune	250	6.5	2.60
Pelforth is synonymous with quality in France. This superb brown ale is malty and nutty. The fruity caramel finish is topped off with a hint of chocolate, yummy.				
	12. Les Trois Monts	750	8.5	6.90
The light fresh hoppy aroma is little preparation for this beer. The flavour gives away its strength, with spicy vanilla and fruity melon to the fore, alongside the hops. The after-taste is warming and bitter-sweet, well done France! (Ooh, it's big too!)

A rich, nutty flavour and a slightly sweet edge to this black beer – not a stout!				
Kenya	17. Tusker	500	4.2	3.30
Dryness and bitterness predominate in this well-hopped African beauty. Ah, those safari memories...				
Laos	18. Beer Lao	330	5.0	2.60
Clean, crisp and refreshing – Russell's favourite Asian (beer!)				
Mexico	19. Negra Modelo	330	5.3	2.80
A subtle malt complexity, with notes of milk-chocolate and dried raisins. Refreshing for a dark beer.				
Mongolia	20. Baadog	330	4.6	2.80
An earthy, smoky aroma leads into a toasted malt flavour. Light hop notes balance it all out.				
New Zealand	21. Speights	330	4.0	2.60
A well-rounded beer, with a malty, nutty taste. Not too bitter, unlike some Kiwis I know!				
Spain	22. Alhambra Reserva	330	6.4	2.80
Crisp, clean and tasty, with plenty of body and some bitterness. The prince of Spanish beers.				
Thailand	23. Singha	330	6.0	2.60
Premium lager with a hint of sweetness. The hop aromas suggest lemon flowers and cinnamon.				
United States	24. Anchor Liberty	355	5.9	2.90
An initial sharp, bitter hoppiness, blends into a pleasant, complex, balance of hops and malt, with the slight sweetness of vanilla.				
	25. Anchor Porter	355	5.6	2.90
A rich, complex, yet drinkable brew, with chocolate-malty sweetness – full, creamy and satisfying.				

26. Broadway Doggie Style Pale Ale 355 4.7 2.90
Extreme lemony hops aroma, which continues to dominate the flavour to the end.
Very drinkable.

27. Brooklyn Stout 355 10.6 3.20
Intensely bitter, with heavy roast/burnt malt flavours, yet remarkably smooth and creamy.

28. Great Divide Titan IPA 355 6.8 3.20
Hop notes of orange and pine, followed by a surprising malty sweetness. The hops break through at the death to give a very dry finish.

29. Goose Island Honkers Ale 355 5.0 2.90
A sweetish malt aroma, but fruity hop flavours predominate, with a hint of toffee in the aftertaste.

30. Sierra Nevada Celebration Ale 330 6.8 3.20
A blend of hops give a complex fruitiness and a decidedly bitter finish to counterbalance the malty sweetness.

Czech Republic **31. Gambrinus** 500 5.0 3.30
A slight smokiness, balanced by citrus hops, from a true lager of Plzen.

32. Lobkowicz 500 5.0 3.30
Pale Bohemian lager, from one of the oldest Czech brewing families. Very pale and dry.

Estonia **33. A. le Coq Premium** 500 5.0 3.30
Supplied to both the Imperial Russian army **and** the Red army, this well made lager is a perfect thirst-quencher

Germany **34. Bolten Ur Altbier** 500 4.8 3.30
Dark amber beer with a brisk aroma. Tastes quite dry, with a slight sweetness in the aftertaste.

35. Erdinger Hefeweissbier 500 5.3 3.30
A classic Bavarian wheat beer. The unfiltered yeast gives a cloudy appearance to this clean-tasting refresher.

36. Erdinger Pikantus 500 7.3 3.50
Dark bock bier with a sharp, full aroma. Selected dark wheat and barley malts are matured for longer to give a smoother flavour.

37. Freiland Museum Dunkel 500 5.0 3.30
An aroma of roasted coffee and cocoa beans, a hint of smokiness and a pleasant, dry finish.

38. Fruh Kolsch 500 4.8 3.30
A fresh, light, fruity ale, with a touch of bitter hops. Kolsch beers are brewed exclusively in Cologne.

39. Hacker-Pschorr 1417 500 5.5 3.30
A slightly sweet, citrus aroma, with a hint of bread dough! Light fruitiness predominates in this example from one of Germany's oldest breweries.

	55. Hovels Bitterbier	500	5.5	3.30
This unusual beer from Dortmund has a light treacle flavour, which becomes more chocolatey as you drink it. A rare brew indeed!				
	40. Kloster Andechs Doppelbock	500	7.1	3.50
The quality oozes from this Benedictine monastic beer. Dark fruits, coffee and a pleasing yeastiness. Toasty, nutty and just plain gorgeous – enjoy.				
	41. Monchshof Schwarzbier	500	4.9	3.30
A beautiful balance between dark, malt roastiness and dry, refreshing hops. Very drinkable.				
	42. Rhenania Alt	500	4.8	3.30
A woody aroma leads into a complex flavour montage of fruit, caramel, liquorice and chocolate.				
	43. Schneider Aventinus	500	8.0	3.50
A truly hedonistic experience! Spicy aromas and complex, chocolate, fruity flavours. A classic Doppel Bock.				
	44. Schweinfurt Dunkel Kellerbier	500	5.3	3.30
The slight, yeasty sweetness is tempered by dark roast malt flavours. This complex beer leaves you with some suggestive hops, tempting you to another!				
	45. Tucher Original Urbrau	500	4.9	3.30
A beautifully hopped Helles beer, with a crisp taste and a light, bitter finish.				
	46. Weltenberger Kloster Asam-Bock	500	6.5	3.50
Character and complexity, from the world's oldest monastic brewery. Toffee, coffee, fruit, nuts and roasted grain flavours – more please!				
	47. Weltenberger Kloster Barock Dunkel	500	4.5	3.30
A rich, full-bodied Doppel Bock with a lightly-roasted, malty flavour that punches above its weight.				
	48. Weltenberger Kloster Barock Hell	500	5.3	3.30
Earthy malt flavours, balanced by orange fruitiness and peppery hops – lovely session beer.				
Poland	49. Zubr	500	6.0	3.30
A relatively bitter lager, with hops riding over the traditional malty flavour. Crisp and clean on the palate.				
	50. Dębowe Mocne	500	7.0	3.30
Slight citrus and toffee aroma leads into a full malty lager, with a decent hoppy finish. Doesn't taste its strength!				
	51. Redds Apple	500	4.5	3.30
A dark golden beer with (surprise!) a refreshing apple flavour – a hint of ginger gives it a pleasant zingy finish.				
	52. Redds Red	500	4.5	3.30
This is another fruit beer. The aroma is of raspberries, but the flavour hints at other red fruits being involved – hence the name!				

Russia	53. Ochakovo Black	500	3.9	3.30
The expected burnt aroma is complemented by spicy notes, which are reflected in the flavour. These give way to a caramel, almost burnt jam finish.				
	54. Ochakovo Ruby	500	4.1	3.50
Hints of red summer fruits in the aroma, these give a clue to the plummy caramel flavours which develop.				
Belgium	56. La Chouffe	750	8.0	6.90
A hazy pale gold beer, spiced with coriander. This powerful blonde is big enough to satisfy two of you!				
	57. Cantillon Gueuze-Lambic Bio	375	5.0	3.60
The classic Lambic (wild yeast, hazy gold, definitive dry sourness).				
	58. Liefmans Frambozen	375	4.5	3.90
Mature brown ale, re-fermented with raspberries and jam-packed with intense fruit flavours.				
	59. Liefmans Kriek	375	6.0	3.90
The addition of cherries during secondary fermentation gives this brown ale a tart finish worthy of Les Folies Bergère.				
	60. Bush Ambreé	250	12.0	2.80
Belgium's strongest beer, with a distinctive flavour and bitterness.				
	61. Chapeau Banana	250	3.0	2.30
Dark golden banana sweetness, with just a thread of tartness.				
	62. Chimay Triple	330	8.0	3.00
The hoppiest offering from the Trappists, yet still delightfully fruity – long, dry aftertaste.				
	63. Delirium Nocturnum	330	9.0	3.20
Deep chestnut colour. Initial slight sweetness develops into a more bitter, rounded flavour.				
	64. Floris Chocolat	330	4.0	2.50
Cloudy chocolate colour, smooth chocolate taste, light and refreshing.				
	65. Floris Honey	330	4.0	2.50
Pale gold wheat beer, sweetened by the addition of Belgian honey.				
	66. Floris Ninkeberry	330	3.0	2.50
Light in colour, slightly sweet with apricot, mango and peach flavours mingling on your palate.				
	67. Gouden Carolus Classic	330	8.0	3.00
A dark red ale with a complex fruity aroma reminiscent of Port wine. A velvety texture and some delicate darker flavours enhance your pleasure as you swallow.				
	68. Gouden Carolus Hopsinjoor	330	8.0	3.00
A warm, fruit-cake spiciness. Four hop varieties are used and give a pleasant bitter finish. Gold medal Zythus Beer Festival 2008.				
	69. Grottenbier	330	6.5	2.80
Rare cave-beer. A dark chestnut ale with full-bodied maltiness, balanced by a crisp, dry spiciness.				
	70. Gulden Draak	330	10.5	3.60
Dark brown, mellow yet full-bodied with a toffee sweetness. A hint of medicinal herbs.				

.	71. Pilaarbijter Blonde	330	7.5	2.80
Pale malts, Saaz hops and three weeks lagering lead to this crisp, fruity blonde. Who could resist?				
	72. Timmermans Peche	250	4.0	2.50
A light sweet fruit lambic, filled with juicy peach flavours.				
Netherlands	73. Lamme Goedzak	330	6.5	2.80
A super all-rounder. Caramel malt, spicy hops and a mild, fruity sweetness all suspended in a hazy golden mist. Trippy man!				
	74. Dulle Griet	330	8.5	3.20
A dark fruity beer, with some port wine characteristic sweetness. Plum and dark berry flavours, but sufficient hops for a drier, bitter finish.				
	75. Merck Toch Hoe Sterck	330	9.0	3.20
Lovely complexity of flavours. Dried fruits, nuts, chocolate, malty sweetness and earthy yeast undertones. Power to your palate.				
	76. Oesterstout	330	8.5	3.20
Oyster shell filters impart a marine tang to a dark roast stout. Slight coffee-fudge sweetness, but a bitter finish.				
Gluten Free	78. St. Peter's G-Free	500	4.2	2.80
Aromas of citrus and mandarin from American Amarillo hops, leading to a crisp, clean, pilsner style finish.				
Fat Cat Brews	79. Fat Cat Stout Cat	500	4.6	2.50
Characteristic sweet, rich flavour of roast malt and molasses, well balanced with classic English Fuggles hops.				
	80. Fat Cat Marmalade Cat	500	5.5	2.60
The hint of citrus bitterness comes from a blend of Goldings and Fuggles hops. A full-bodied traditional English strong ale.				
	81. Fat Cat IPA	500	7.0	3.40
Brewed in the style of old-fashioned IPA's, to last and last. Very high hop levels pack enough punch to subdue the malt strength.				
Bottled Ciders	82. Magners Irish Cider	500	4.5	3.00
You all know it! Is it hot? Do we have ice? Crisp, dry Irish cider. Bring your own craic...				
	83. Aspall Peronelle's Blush Cyder	500	5.4	3.20
Aspalls traditional Suffolk cyder, with a dash of blackberry liqueur to give a rounded fruitiness to the usual tangy cider flavour.				
	84. Thatchers Pear Cider	500	4.5	3.00
A blend of cider and perry, the first combined apple/pear fermentation available in England. Supremely refreshing.
